

CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

West Silver Lake Drive Construction to Start Week of March 23

The Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) will start construction of the Silver Lake Reservoir Complex Bypass Project the week of March 23, 2015 and will continue through late 2016/early 2017. The new water pipeline will be installed along West Silver Lake Drive and within the Silver Lake Reservoir Complex.

Work Areas 1 & 2: West Silver Lake Drive from Hawick Street to Armstrong Avenue **Duration: 8 to 10 months**

Traffic will be limited to one northbound lane on West Silver Lake Drive from Hawick Street to Armstrong Avenue. Southbound traffic will be detoured onto Armstrong Avenue to Silver Lake Boulevard. Traffic officers will be on-site to assist vehicles through the area as the new traffic plan is implemented. No street parking allowed. Access to homes and driveways will be maintained. See Community Meeting information on reverse.

A pedestrian detour will be provided to maintain a continuous path around the reservoir complex. During this construction, Ivanhoe Reservoir will be drained and the shade balls removed. Ivanhoe Reservoir will be partially refilled during the remainder of the construction.

Two-way traffic and street parking will be restored once Work Areas 1 & 2 are completed.

Work Area 3: Silver Lake Reservoir Complex/Silver Lake Reservoir **Duration: Fall 2015 – Late 2016/early 2017**

Silver Lake Reservoir will be emptied for approximately 12 months to allow the installation of a large diameter pipeline along the bottom of the reservoir. LADWP will also construct a regulator station along the northwest bank of Silver Lake Reservoir. The new regulator station and pipeline will not be visible once Silver Lake Reservoir is refilled.

Construction Hours: Typical construction hours are Monday – Friday, 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Work hours may be extended to 8 p.m. as needed. Some Saturday work may be required.

Why is the Project Necessary?

Changes in state and federal drinking water quality regulations required Silver Lake and Ivanhoe Reservoirs to be taken out of service and disconnected from the Los Angeles' drinking water distribution system. The drinking water storage previously provided by these reservoirs is being replaced by Headworks Reservoir, located near Griffith Park. The new bypass pipeline will connect Headworks Reservoir to the rest of the City's water distribution system to continue to safely and reliably deliver water to the eastern and southern areas of the City of Los Angeles. Once the project is completed, Silver Lake and Ivanhoe Reservoirs will be refilled, but will no longer be part of the Los Angeles' drinking water system.

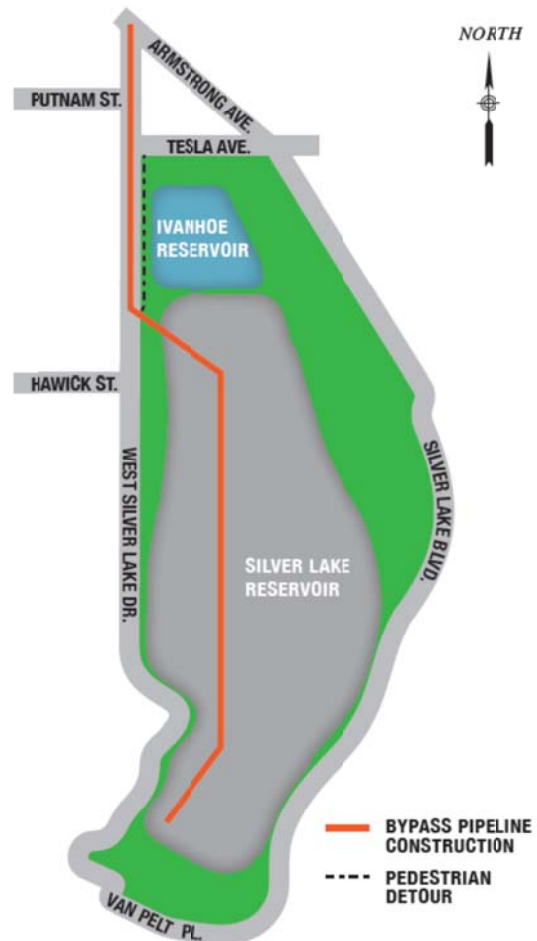
